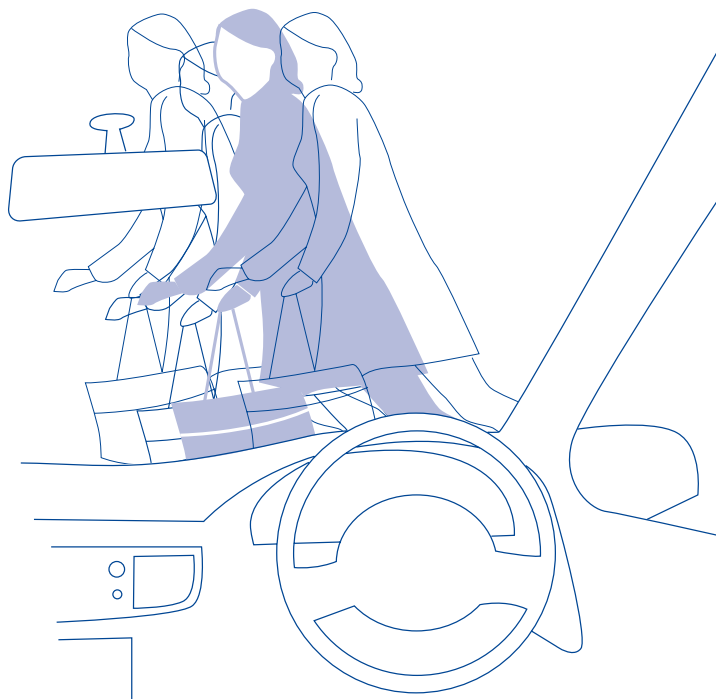


## How did you get on this programme?

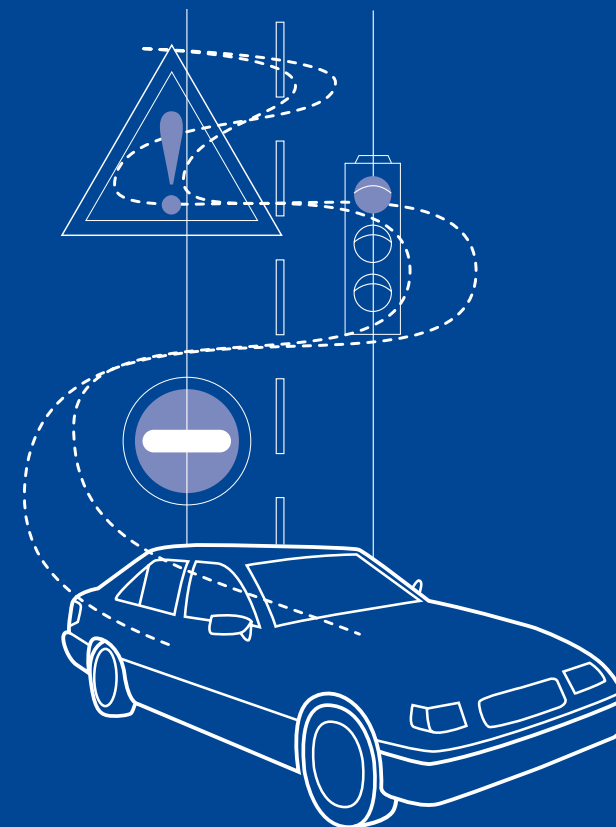

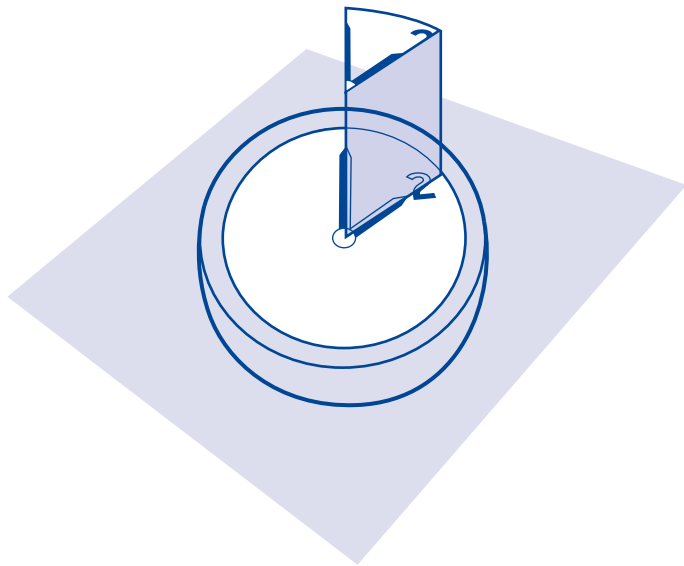

## Why are you on this programme?

This programme can reduce your chances of getting involved again in drink drive crimes.

How?

By giving you the facts and making you more aware of how to tackle your problems in other ways.



## Programme targets

By the end of the programme you will have had an opportunity to talk about:

- How drinking alcohol like beer, wine and spirits affects your body, and makes you a less able driver.
- Your thoughts and feelings about this type of offence.
- How your drinking and driving can affect other people.
- Why you acted the way you did.
- How your feelings can rule the way you think – and act.
- When and how much you drink, and why you drink.
- The many choices that are open to you rather than drinking and driving.

## What will you have to do?

- You must go to all of the 14 group sessions. This works out at two hours per week. There will also be some one-to-one sessions with you and the group tutor.
- You will be required to sign a contract that sets out the rules of attendance on this programme.
- The contract also includes the rules about a Community Rehabilitation Order – and they must be followed. Failing to turn up for the programme means you will be sent back to court.
